



Hourly Relief

The Family Home Program seeks to provide a place for people to develop positive relationships, enhance social and life skills and really become a valued and active member of the Sudbury community. Individuals from our program are matched with relief workers to participate in various community activities. Relief workers sometimes help a person with an intellectual disability participate in their choice of recreational and leisure activities (i.e.: billiards, dancing, bingo, etc.). Other activities can include going to the movies, outdoor activities, going to concerts, skills development, and much more.

All relief workers go through a screening process which consists of an interview, reference checks and a criminal record check. A background in developmental services, teaching, nursing, social services or personal support is preferred, but not required. Experience working with adults that have developmental challenges, a valid driver's licence and access to a vehicle with appropriate liability insurance would be considered assets.

Hourly relief workers receive financial remuneration, make a difference in the lives of the people they support, develop lasting and meaningful relationships, gain valuable experience, and help the individuals they support to build self-esteem and self-confidence.
